#### **Payments**

Just a reminder that all payments to the school are via an online payment system called ParentPay, which entitles you to control and manage your money for your child/ren. We do request that you regularly login to your account so you can have an overview of what needs to be paid. This does not apply to donations such as non-uniform/bake sales, this will remain a cash donation.

#### **ParentPay / PayPoint**

All children have their own account, with their own unique username and password, and once activated and registered, you have control of any payments. ParentPay allows you to make payments via your Credit or Debit Card. If you do not have either of these cards, you can make payments via a PayPoint shop such as supermarkets, petrol stations and any other shop with the PayPoint logo. All you need to do is speak to the school office and request for a PayPoint barcode letter, where there will be instructions on how to pay.
